FRUIT 'N' VEG MONTH 2010

FRUIT AND VEG: HOW MUCH IS ENOUGH?

Eating 2 serves of fruit and 5 serves of vegetables is a good rule of thumb for the family in general. Take a moment to look at the table below to find out how many serves each member of your family needs to eat. We will look at how much a "serve" is in the next newsletter.



AGE (years)	VEGETABLES (serves)	FRUIT (serves)
4 – 7	2 - 4	1 – 2
8 – 11	3 - 5	1 – 2
Adults	5	2

You will notice that the amount that children need to eat changes based on their age, appetite and levels of activity. Pregnant and breastfeeding women and adolescents need to eat more again – if this applies to your family, log onto www.gofor2and5.com.au for more information.

Unfortunately most families in NSW do not eat enough fruit and veg. In fact, 90% of adults don't eat enough veg and 50% don't eat enough fruit. For children in NSW, 85% do not eat enough vegetables and 30% do not eat enough fruit.
