Principals Message

Beat the heat-Heat waves or long periods of extreme heat can have serious impacts on people's health. Planning ahead and being prepared for extreme heat is important and these pages will help you prepare for hot weather.

We provide you with information on how hot weather influences your health, how you can prepare for and stay healthy in the heat, how you can recognise and treat heat-related illness, and how you can care for people who are at risk of heat-related illness.



NO HAT, PLAY UNDER THE COLA- In the hot summer months remember to encourage your child to protect themselves from the sun by:

□Always applying sunscreen at home and before they go outside

Always wearing a hat and long sleeve/collar top when playing outside
 Try to stay in the shade during peak UV forecasts

□Always bring a bottle of water to school to keep hydrated.

A reminder the **Central Coast Council** will be running a **Food Smart Workshop**. This

workshop is aimed at the family, parents and teacher communities.

The Food Waste Workshop will cover the important issues of

- Avoidable Food Waste
- Composting
- Worm farming

Each household on participation will receive a free compost bin or worm farm and will also be given information, tools and inspiration to implement proven simple behaviours aimed at reducing avoidable food waste in the home. Given that average NSW household throws out about \$70 worth of edible food every week, everyone likes to save money, time and effort. You are invited to participate on Friday 30 November at 9.30am. The Taragal Glen Retirement Village will be visiting our school on Thursday 15 November. All our families and community members are also invited to join the residents from the village and see our children perform some items for our visiting audience. Our school will serve a mornina tea for our families and community members. The morning will commence at 10.30am followed by



morning tea. If you are interested in attending please contact the school for catering purposes.

Last week the Stage 1 students planted some waratah seeds and native fuchsia seeds in the hope we can grow native plant seedlings. Our local community groups will benefit from the plants once we establish them enough to survive the weather extremes in time to come. We will be collecting seeds from our surrounding bush to also propagate local indigenous plants to use on special days like Schools Tree Day. We welcome any donation of seeds to keep our greenhouse producing native vegetation for all uses in the community as well as vegetable gardening. All families and community members are invited to use our facilities to generate **plants** for use in the community or help our students with garden type projects.

We are saying goodbye to 12 students to high school for next year and currently only have 4 enrolments for 2019. If you know of anyone who may have a child who will be starting Kindergarten in 2019 or do you know someone with a child due to start school next year, please ask them to contact the school.

PPE by Benji

Fire fighters wear special clothing to protect themselves from the many dangers they meet.

GOGGLES

Goggles protect the eyes from smoke. They're also made from plastic and elastic.

JACKET

Firefighters wear a protective jacket to stop themselves from getting burnt. They can hold a lot of things in pockets.

BLADDER

Firefighters wear a water bladder that stores water for drinking.

BOOTS

The boots protect the fire fighter from the hot embers on the ground. They're also steel capped and thick-<u>soled.</u>

HELMET

Firefighters wear a protective and hard helmet protect them from falling branches and other dangers.

PPE BY ISABELLA

Firefighters wear a special uniform to protect themselves from burning fires and many other dangers that they meet.

Firefighters wear gloves to protect their hands and wrists so they can open doors and touch things without getting burnt.

They also wear a long sleeved shirt to protect their arms, stomach and chest so they don't get burnt in those areas.

The long yellow pants protect their legs from big long sticks and other sharp things.

The hard and thick helmet protects their head from falling trees and their hair from burning.

Firefighters wear heavy black boots with a zipper to protect their feet from hot things on the ground.

The stretchy elastic goggles protect their eyes from smoke and flying plastic.
