Principal's Message

Bushfire season is always a stern reminder of our responsibilities as staff, parents or community members. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all our parents for their understanding on the first catastrophic fire danger day I have been involved in in my 27 years of teaching. The Department of Education and RFS advisors were very supportive, making the process clear, concise and procedures and effective. With a huge number of fires occurring across the state it was a sensible decision not to create any further incidents locally that may have stretched the resources within the fire services. Let's hope we do not have any further catastrophic fire days, and all families are now prepared at home in the event an unfortunate fire arises. Prevention is always better than managing a bushfire.

Last year the Small Schools Spectacular was a first-class production and the largest annual small schools' event of its kind anywhere in the region. The Small Schools Spectacular will be back in 2020 and the show will once again involve Central Mangrove PS, Jilliby PS, Kulnura PS, Somersby PS and Wyong Creek PS. A show of this magnitude requires much preparation. In addition to the actual performance the rehearsals and behind the preparation will enrich scenes our participating students learning immensely.



It will be a privilege for all participating students to be part of the performance and I would like to take this opportunity to give each family as much notice as possible in preparation for the spectacular.

Last week our Small Schools Relay Team of Noah C, Angus G, Memphis S and Charlie L competed at the NSW PSSA State Athletics Carnival. We are proud of their efforts finishing third in their heat. Thank you to all the parents who transported their child to the venue. We hope it was a great experience for the team. Very few schools have students that get the opportunity to represent at state level. This year Kulnura Public School has achieved fantastic results at state level on the sporting field.

Congratulations to all our graduates from Children's University. The activities undertaken for the Children's University initiative help students to think about how they learn outside of school of school. The activities the students noted in their passports are valuable and worthwhile learning and encourage students to get involved in the wider community. Thank you to all parents and carers who supported their children with their learning passports.

The Coding Workshops will be offered again in 2020 in the same format as this year.
